Trustees Report and Accounts for the year to 30th September 2022

Cranshaws, Ellemford and Longformacus Community Association is a charitable unincorporated association. It has been established to enter into agreements with wind farm operators whereby funds are paid for the benefit of local residents.

The charity made the decision during 2014 to be known as Lammermuir Community Fund for promotional purposes in order to differentiate it from other community organaisations that are also available to residents in the local area.

It has set up and administers a system for disbursing the funds received as a result of such agreements. The association has an agreement with two wind farm operators resulting in four separate annual community payments being received each year.

During the past year the association has approved 3 new applications and has continued to fund 31 running projects, all benefiting local residents, as detailed in the notes to the annual accounts.

The Trustees have decided to set aside 10% of any wind farm income received each year to enable the charity to build up reserves to be used for any large community projects that may arise.

With regards to project 161 – Community Playpark financed between Fred Olsen and Community Windfarm Aikengall, CELCA transferred £47,801 from a set-a-side fund.

Within project 38 – Woodland walk, an additional amount of £9,995 was allocated for play equipment.
