ENTRY ARRANGEMENTS:

- All vegetables and handicrafts should be this year's work.
- Each entry must be accompanied by a sealed envelope with the class number written on the outside (*and age, if the exhibitor is a child or under 25*) with the name and address inside.
- All entries must be in the tent by **10.30 a.m.**
- Entries are auctioned at the end of the afternoon. If you wish to retain your entry please write '**Not for Auction**' on the outside of the envelope and collect it just **AFTER 3 p.m.** (or ask someone to collect it for you)
- Only one entry per person is permitted in each class, other than in the Crafts (Class 29-36) with **up to 2 entries** and the Stick sections.
- The entry fee is 10p for each class, apart from the children's classes, which are free. Entry fees to be paid at the door on the day of the show, or left in the envelope accompanying the exhibit if you arrive before **9 a.m.**
- Any pastry should be homemade. Preserves must be covered with a wax disc plus either cellophane or a new screw top.
- Judging will take place from **11 a.m. – 12 noon** after which the tent will be open to the public. The Judge has the right to withhold any prize.
- **Prize giving: approx 14.30 p.m. Prizes: 1st - 50p, 2nd - 30p, 3rd - 20p**

An auction will take place in the tent at approx 3.15 p.m. and the proceeds will be used to support the Industrial Section.
